#### **Dear Parents**

Unfortunately, we have been told of parents driving far too fast and extremely dangerously on the road outside the school. In a recent incident, one of our neighbours, who was walking along the road, was forced to take evasive action to avoid a car. The neighbour was then subjected to verbal abuse. This is a situation that we take very seriously and cannot be tolerated as many of our children use the road in the mornings and afternoons. If there are any witnesses to the incident, please contact me in the utmost confidence.

There are new rules concerning GDPR (General Data Protection Regulation) coming into effect on 25<sup>th</sup> May 2018. This will affect how we contact parents regarding information and updates from the school. We will shortly be sending home parental consent forms for each pupil which will require a positive opt-in and which will also be sent home annually in September. The trolley will be running on a Tuesday and Thursday break time starting on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> May. Items will be priced between 10p and 40p and will include crackers and bread with fair trade honey, peanut butter, jam, Kit Kats and

warm tea and cocoa. It will be run on a credit system so that children do not have to look after or lose money. Therefore if your child wishes to purchase anything from the trolley, please send money to the office in a named envelope. The children on the council will manage sales by deducting from the credit available for each child. Profits will be used to re stock the trolley and also sent to charity at the end of the school year.
