Dear Parents and carers

It has been another busy two weeks with some super learning taking place. Some highlights are the amazing death masks that Badger class are creating, some truly amazing writing in Owl class and some wonderful habitat learning in Squirrel class. I will post some photographs of these things on Facebook as soon as teachers send them to me.

As some of you know, we are currently running a consultation to decide whether or not to reopen the preschool. I posted the consultation on Facebook and Class Dojo earlier this week. If you do have children who are of pre-school age or know of anyone who has children in this age bracket, I would be grateful if you could pass this on as we want the consultation to be as representative as possible. I will keep everyone updated with progress on this and will notify you all if and when the pre-school will reopen once a decision has been made.

On a separate note, I am happy to announce that after Easter, we will be able to extend our wraparound care providing after school childcare if it is required. This will be an on-demand service and we will require it to be booked in advance- the booking will need to be made by 12pm on the Friday before you require the place. Fees for this will be £6 for the first hour and £10 for the second hour. This is another mechanism through which we are trying to ensure we are meeting the needs of our community and although the provision may not be required on a regular basis, we hope that having it as an option will be helpful to families as different situations arise.

Finally, I wanted to update you that after discussion with Mrs Hancock, we have decided to move to a monthly rather than a fortnightly newsletter. We post regularly on Dojo and according to our records all parents have access to this. Operationally, it makes sense to do newsletters slightly less frequently but ensure things like dates etc. are included further in advance. If anyone has any concerns about this, I will happily speak with them, but we think this will help increase efficiency in the office and save you all reading newsletters which do not really give any new information. We will, however, keep this under review and if it is not working, we will adapt accordingly. Newsletters will now be sent out on the last Friday of each month during term time.

As always, I can be contacted through dojo if you have any questions or wish to discuss anything. Have a great weekend.
