Dear Parents and carers

Happy belated Easter and welcome to the first half of the summer term. With the weather improving, we have had lots of opportunities to learn outdoors, and it has been wonderful to see children using the outside environment both for their play and for their learning. Year Six have been busily preparing for their SATs which will take place next week. Children seem very prepared for this, and I am sure they will be successful. There will be a few areas which will be restricted to just Year Six during this week, but this should not affect other year groups.

I am very excited to announce that we will be reopening the pre-school in September for children aged 3 and over. Initially, we will offer mornings only but as people sign up, we may be able to offer more times. We will be recruiting our pre-school manager next week and I will give more information at that time. If you would like your child to attend Trekenner Pre School, you can collect an admissions form from the office. Spaces are limited so do fill in your form sooner rather than later to avoid disappointment.

School attendance is improving so thank you so much for all of your help with this. It is, however, still much lower than it was last year. Please may I remind you that is it important that children only miss time from school if absolutely needed. Often, if children feel a little unwell in the morning parents are opting to keep them home whereas actually, they are probably well enough to be in school. There has been some recent anecdotal research which suggests that this shift in threshold is left over from the pandemic which is understandable. Our advice to all of you is for children to come into school- even if they are feeling a little under the weather because 9 times out of 10, they end up perking up and are fine. In any situation where children come in feeling a little unwell and they don't perk up or present as being too unwell to be in school, we would always call you. There is a direct correlation between children's attendance and the progress they make in school so I really hope everyone can help us to continue to improve attendance across the school so that everyone reaches their target of maintaining 95% attendance across the year.

As a final note, I wanted to assure everyone that arrangements for school leadership and staffing next year are all in hand. Mandy Precious, Chair of Governors, will write to you all to confirm details in due course.


