We can accept payment daily, weekly, half-termly or termly in advance only. Please pay promptly at the start of the new term, as due to new guidelines from Cornwall Council, we are not permitted to allow arrears to occur.

Don't forget that Chartwells are continuing to reward children from years 3 - 6 who have school dinners every day, by giving their Friday meal to them free of charge. This will result in the cost of a week's dinners being £9.20 instead of £11.50 To benefit, school dinners must be ordered Monday to Thursday inclusive and be paid for either in advance or on the day. The scheme will operate weekly so 'rollovers' in the case of illness or other absence will not be permitted.
