Pupil Parliament elections

We will be holding elections for pupil parliament during the week commencing 20th September. Any child in any year group can put themselves forward for the parliament all they need to do is create a poster, a short speech or a presentation to persuade children in the school to vote for them. Pupil Parliament is an important role within the school as these children will have the very important job of helping me to make important decisions about the school.

Morning drop-off and after school collection

So far, our new arrangements for children being dropped off in the morning seem to be working well. As a reminder, the school gates will open from 8:40 and an adult will be available to supervise children on the playground. At 8:50, the children will then go into the classroom to begin morning learning. The start

of formal lessons is 9am and so long as children arrive before this time, they will not be marked as late. We encourage children to arrive before 9 where possible as it allows time for morning challenges and other focused learning which can be really beneficial for them.

For the first couple of weeks, parents of our youngest children have been brining their children to the classroom door, which is absolutely fine; however, we would appreciate it if children could be dropped at the gate as soon as you feel they are ready to do so. The reason for our morning arrangements is to manage congestion on the road outside of school, so having that steady flow of traffic would be really helpful.

At the end of the day, children can be collected from Owl classroom door between 3:15 and 3:30. It would be helpful for staff if you could come up to the door and ask for your child. Whilst we know most parents, some new members of staff are still getting used to everyone so if you could come up to the door and ask for the child you are collecting, that would be appreciated.

As a final note, I have been asked to remind our community about the voluntary one-way system in place. If parents could ensure they are approaching the school going down the hill rather than coming the other way, that would be really helpful.
