### **Comic Relief**

Unfortunately, we are not able to hold our traditional range of fund raising for Comic Relief this year.

However, we would still like to support the charity. Therefore, on Friday 19<sup>th</sup> March, we are happy to see children wearing anything red or anything in keeping with the sentiments of Comic Relief. Minimum donation of £1 per child.

Friday is also PE day for Badgers and Owls, so please bear this in mind as the 'red' clothes should be appropriate for PE too.

## **Summary of our current Covid Regulations**

- Any children or adults that have symptoms of COVID are asked not to come into school. They should seek a test and follow NHS isolation rules. If a child shows symptoms of COVID during the day, they will be moved into the library where they will be looked after at a distance by a member of staff until someone can collect them.
- All adults will always wear face coverings when in communal areas in school. This includes in the classroom. We are
  not going to be asking children to wear face coverings in school because research shows that face coverings in young
  children can do more harm than good. However, if you wish for your child to wear a covering, it will be permitted.
- We will have a bubble system operating with Key Stage One and Key Stage two acting as separate bubbles. These bubbles with have different start/ finish times, play in separate areas and will not interact at all throughout the day. Details of staggered starts/ finishes are below.
- Although Owls and Badgers will remain as one class in the afternoon, we will keep consistent groups to minimise contacts. This will include the children staying in their own classroom and consistent seating arrangements.
- Like before, social distancing is not a requirement in primary schools. Squirrels and Badgers will not be expected to socially distance because the negatives to this outweigh the positives in terms of how children of this age learn. Owls class will be encouraged to socially distance where possible but for activities where this is not possible, we will minimise close contact to below 15 minutes as is recommended by Public Health Cornwall.
- All staff in school will now be completing LFT tests twice a week on a Sunday and a Wednesday. This will provide an additional protective measure ensuring that we can act quickly to avoid cases potentially spreading in school.
- There will be no sharing of regularly used equipment between children. To help with this, we request that children bring in their own pencil cases with a pencil, ruler, rubber and colouring pencils. Please could children also bring their own water bottle as usual so we can limit use of cups.
- We will continue to follow enhanced hygiene measures including frequent hand washing, washing of regularly used equipment and surfaces.
- Children should wear uniform as usual but on PE days they can wear their PE kit to school to avoid the need for changing.

There is an overlap of 5 minutes to allow for siblings in the same class to be dropped off at the same time. If you do not have children in different classes children in Key Stage 2 should arrive as close to 8:45 as possible and children in Key Stage 1 arrive as close to 9 as possible.
