Dear Parents and carers

Happy New year and welcome back to school. I hope everyone has had a wonderful holiday.

As always, the first week and a half back at school has been extremely exciting with lots of brilliant learning happening in every class. I particularly enjoyed Squirrel Class launch day where the children participated in a fantastic learning adventure exploring their topic "A Rumble in Rio." I popped into the class several times throughout the day, and I must say the level of engagement and the smiles on the children's faces was wonderful to see. A big well done to the Squirrel team for providing this wonderful opportunity for our children.

I have also been pleased to see how active our pupil Parliament committees have been this term. Our Curriculum Committee have been reflecting on what they think a good lesson should look like and planning a learning walk with me; the Computing Committee have been working on a campaign to help encourage children take better care of computers in school and are planning an exciting assembly for Online Safety Week and our Community Committee have been coming up with fundraising ideas for their project to improve Jubilee field. Amazingly, they have raised £495 already. This puts them at nearly halfway to their target which is amazing considering they only started coming up with ideas last week.

Whilst we are returning to some resemblance of normality after our COVID scare in December, the Omicron variant is still very prevalent in the area. I have been asked by Public Health Cornwall to remind everyone that the best way to stay safe from this and protect others is to get vaccinated and to follow isolation rules. The rules do seem to be changing but to reinforce- the school's stance is that families follow NHS isolation guidance if they receive a positive test. If children have symptoms, we ask that they do an LFD test before coming into school and if they are in the same household as someone who is positive, we ask for LFD tests to be carried out daily. We do, however, strongly encourage children to be in school if they can and if they do not test positive. The DfE asserted again this week that the best place for children to be is in school- particularly given how much they have missed because of the pandemic. Therefore, we urge everyone to try to ensure their children's attendance remains strong. If pupils are in school every day, I am confident that the recovery curriculum plans we have in place will minimise the impact of this last two years and ensure children continue to thrive and achieve their potential.
