

# NEWSLETTER 8th March 2018

#### **Dear Parents**

Welcome back to the second half of the Spring term – although the weather is certainly not Spring-like. Please make sure that every child has warm outdoor coats, hats and gloves with them every day while we are in the middle of this very cold weather.

The decision to close the school on Thursday and Friday was not an easy one to make. Careful consideration was given to all the weather conditions and to all the surrounding roads. Ultimately the safety and wellbeing of the children and staff at the school are my major concern. We discovered that the Pre-School had frozen pipes and received a red weather warning for nearby Devon, so therefore we could not open. Once the decision had been made we were able to notify all the local radio stations via County Hall very quickly and subsequently parents were informed of the situation. We also gave updates of the conditions on the school's website, which many of you used. I am pleased to report that not a single child arrived at the school on Thursday, which was a great relief and also meant that our advice to regularly check the website was followed. Thank you to all our families and friends for helping to make sure that everyone was aware of the situation.

We would also like to apologise as this newsletter was due to be given to parents on Thursday, which obviously was not possible.

Many of our children have been affected by illness recently. Please advise the school on the first morning of illness. The guidelines from Public Health England for sickness and diarrhoea are that children should stay away until they have been free of symptoms for at least 48 hours.

We are sorry to report that Mrs Dodge is still not able to return to work. We send her our best wishes and hope that she soon feels better. We are hopeful that she will return soon but in the meantime we will continue with our current teaching arrangements for Squirrels Class in order to maintain continuity.

We have been contacted by Tamar Housing, who have a flat for rent in the Parish. More information is enclosed with the newsletter and please pass this information on to anyone who you think maybe interested.

Also enclosed are the World Book tokens for children to obtain their free books.
