# **Curriculum Information – Badgers Autumn Term 2**

This booklet outlines the learning your child will be experiencing this term. Our topics bring subject areas together in a purposeful and engaging way, providing opportunity for children to develop, consolidate and apply skills and knowledge in new and novel situations. If you have more than one child, you may notice similar knowledge and skills being repeated within and between Key Stages. Children will revisit concepts and skills, experiencing greater depth as they progress through the school.

Living, Learning and Laughing Together

**English** This term, our class text is Secrets of a Sun King by Emma Carroll. Non fiction focus will be Explanation texts and Diaries. We will be focusing our narrative writing on creating atmosphere and setting; building tension and momentum to mystery and adventure writing. Using scripts and poems to perform. We will finish the term with some poetry with water themes.

Grammar will remain a focus with emphasis on openers, conjunctions and verb tenses.

ART and DT. Exploring the style of Egyptian art and creating a Death Mask. We will explore the art of Angie Lewin and develop printing techniques. In DT we will be exploring the Egyptian Shaduf using levers to support lifting loads. Explore foods of the Egyptian region and design meals to support healthy digestion.

**Science** We will be learning about Teeth and Digestion in term 1: the jobs of different types of teeth, the basic functions of the different parts of the human digestive system and interpreting food chains.

In term 2 we will be learning about plants: the functions of different parts of flowering plants, plants requirements for life, how water is transported and pollination occurs.

## **Mathematics**

We will link History to Geography through exploring the importance of the Nile River and its fertile plains for the people of Egypt past and present. How has it influenced settlement, transport and farming? We develop skills of enquiry by comparing learning about the Rivers of the Tamar and Plym and their role in our local history and lives
