We were very sad to cancel the Duck Race and were sorry that many were disappointed. We have rescheduled for **Saturday 1st June** when hopefully the weather will be kinder to us. Please meet and park at Treburley Club at 2.00pm for a 2.30pm race start. Sadly we are not able to permit dogs. After the race there will be refreshments and cakes available – if you are able to donate or buy a cake for the sale, we would be grateful. Ducks are still available from the office to buy for £1 each and we have already received some wonderful prizes. Please come along and join us for this popular family day.



SATS – SATS will take place for Year 6 during the week beginning May 13th so it is important that all children are in school during this period – unless they are really ill of course! It is also very important for children to arrive on time. We are offering Year 6 children a free breakfast club place, Monday to Thursday. The children will be given breakfast and have a chance to socialise before coming into school. Optional SATS will

also be held in May for the other children of Class 2 and Year 2 children will be completing KS1 tasks as well.



BIKEABILITY We are very lucky to have Tony Walters return to the school on 23rd & 24th May who will be running the Bikeability sessions for some of our year 6 children. Official permission forms and information will be sent home shortly.

SCHOOL MEALS: The School Census will take place on **Thursday 16th May**. The take up of Universal Free School Meals on that day is recorded and the school is reimbursed for that number for the rest of the school year, whether the number increases or not. Previously, the school has carried that shortfall, but this has a significant impact on our already overburdened budget and results in less money available for other resources. We would therefore encourage all children to have the free school meal on census day if they are entitled to it. We will assume that all children in Year 1, 2 & Reception will have the FSM unless you inform us of the reason why your child is not participating. Our catering company, Chartwells have also produced a special menu to appeal to the children.

The menu will consist of Battered Fish or Quorn Dippers, chips, peas or salad followed by ice cream and fruit slices. There is no need to pre-order and the usual cost of £2.50per child will apply.

SPORT & CLUBS:



FOOTBALL: We sadly lost our game against Harrobarrow this week 0 - 4. However our team played well and we were very impressed by their positive attitude.



ATHLETICS & CROSS COUNTRY: The next race will take place at the Duchy on Friday 10th May. Permission slips will be sent home shortly.

CRICKET & ROUNDERS (Older children) Mr Horn will start a cricket and rounders club for the older children on Mondays starting Monday 13th May. This will be for years 3 to 6 and will finish at 4.15pm.

SATS CLUB Mrs Harrison will continue her SATS preparation for Year 2 children on 13th & 20th May only.

FOOTBALL (younger children): The Club has started and will continue to run on **Tuesdays** run by Plymouth Argyll and is open to children from Year 1 – Year 3. As a general rule for football, if it has rained for most of the day and is still raining at 3.00pm, the session will be cancelled. If the session begins in adequate conditions but is interrupted by the weather, we shall as speedily as possible head for Owls Class and play indoor games. On such occasions a towel in your child's Kit bag would be handy.

ENVIRONMENTAL CLUB Miss West will continue to run the Environment Club on Wednesdays, starting on 8th May, 3.15pm – 4.15pm. The last club will be 10th July. This will include gardening and cooking seasonally, running the Eco Council and working on other environmental issues. Children will be working on the issues they are concerned about and want to take action on, and we will be guided by your ideas and passions. As we are so far into the school year, only children who have already joined will be able to continue.

SEWING CLUB Mrs Harrison will be starting a Sewing Club on **Thursday 9th May for** Year 6 children from 3.15pm – 4.15pm. This will be to make a handmade material rabbit as a leaving gift.
