Admission to school in September 2021

If your child was born between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017, you will need to apply for a place in a reception class for September 2021. All applications must be made online via <u>www.cornwall.gov.uk/admissions</u>. Please pass this information on to friends or family who currently do not attend a nursery setting. The deadline for applying is 15th January 2021. The school will be delighted to welcome new parents to visit – please contact the office for an appointment. At the moment we can only meet parents after school hours.
